GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

for bidders at the OstLicht Camera Auction (OstLicht Ges.m.b.H.)

By submitting a written or telephone purchase order, an online bid or by participating in person as a room bidder, each bidder at the OstLicht Camera Auction accepts the terms and conditions of the auction.

The auction is open to the public and shall be conducted in accordance with the regulations of the Trade, Commerce and Industry Regulation Act and in accordance with the legal conditions. Place of execution is the place of business of the Auction House and place of jurisdiction is Vienna.

The valuation and professional definition of the objects were carried out by experts of OstLicht Camera Auction. Errors and misprints may occur. Corrections to the description in the online catalogue can be made up until the auction.

If a bidder is unable to attend the preview, we will be happy to provide additional information by e-mail. Detailed photographs of all objects can be viewed in our online catalogue www.ostlicht-auction.com.

Bids can be submitted in writing (letter or e-mail to: info@ostlicht-auction.com), via our homepage, or via other online platforms. The bids must contain the address of the client, mail and telephone numbers as well as the highest bid in EURO. The bid given by the bidder is the maximum price he is willing to pay without the premium. In any case, the bid will be knocked down at the lowest possible amount for the bidder and a maximum of one bid higher than the second highest bid.

For lots from 500 EURO we also accept telephone bids. Telephone bidders will be called by OstLicht Auctions before the requested lots are opened. However, we cannot guarantee that the telephone connection will be completed. Please register by mail info@ostlicht-auction.com.

Room buyers will receive a bidding number upon presentation of identification or a valid credit card before the auction begins.

The auction house reserves the right to request proof of liquidity from bidders, to require an advance payment for high bids or the deposit of a valid credit card.

The purchase price for lots consists of the hammer price plus the premium of usually 26% (incl. VAT). Exceptions are those lots marked with * next to the starting price. Here the premium is 20% of the hammer price plus 20% VAT of the total price, if these remain or shipped within the EU.

For all lots exported to third countries outside of the European Community or bought with a valid UID number, the Premium is only 20%.

You also have the option of bidding live or placing pre-bids via our own platform (www.ostlicht-auction.com) at no additional cost. If bidding via one of the live bidding platforms (e.g., LiveAuctioneers), an additional fee up to 5% will be charged, depending on the platform.

The auction will take place in the order of the catalogue numbering. The catalogue text of the printed edition of the auction catalogue shall be relevant. The auctioneer is entitled to reject bids and to cancel a knockdown already awarded in order to further increase the value of the item in question. The starting price is the price stated in the catalogue, unless there are several higher written bids. The hammer price is increased by approx. 10% of the starting price. If there are

several identical written bids, the first bid received will be accepted. In principle, no underbids will be accepted. The prices are in EURO, also the invoices must be paid in EURO.

Ownership of the auctioned goods shall not be transferred to the buyer until payment has been made in full. In the event of a successful bid, the buyer undertakes to accept and pay for the lot auctioned by him. The Auctioneer shall not be entitled to take back auctioned items.

The items are insured until 14 days after the auction or until the buyer takes possession of them before the expiry of this period, after which the buyer is liable for the lots purchased by him.

The auctioned lots will only be handed over to the highest bidder after full payment of the hammer price and the buyer's premium, as well as any applicable taxes and fees.

Room bidders must pay for and collect the auctioned item at the end of the auction, unless there are other agreements with the auctioneer. If payment is made by credit card, 3% will be added to the purchase price. For lots purchased in writing, by telephone or online, you will receive an invoice with bank details as soon as possible. These must be paid within 8 days of receipt net without deductions and including bank charges. In the event of late payment, interest on arrears will be charged at a rate of 5% above the base rate of the Austrian National Bank. Costs for packaging, transport and transport insurance are shown separately in the invoice. These are charged at cost price, and we make every effort to offer the most reasonable transport and insurance rates. A storage fee of 5-20 EURO per day and item may be charged for auctioned items that have not been collected after 30 working days from the date of invoice.

In the event of refused acceptance, late payment or non-payment, the buyer shall be liable for all damages and resulting costs.

Lots that have not been paid for or have only been partially paid for may be auctioned again. In this case, the original buyer shall be liable for the reduced price and shall not be entitled to any additional proceeds.

All auction items are available for personal viewing prior to the auction; bidders may request a more specific condition report and more pictures. Also, the online catalogue gives with many detailed pictures a more precise impression of the items. Auctioned items will not be taken back. However, if it is an obvious and serious misdescription and the buyer has not personally inspected the item or requested a condition report, it must be claimed in writing no later than 8 days after receipt of the item (if the payment and shipping went in time). Despite the description in the catalogue, the auction house cannot guarantee the technical function of the auctioned items. If the claim is accepted as valid, the buyer has the right to a refund of the purchase price and the buyer's premium with the return of the auctioned item at the same time.

Unique. fully functional handcrafted model of the UR-Leica by Heinz-Rudolf Oberländer. Rolf Oberländer (1922–1995) devoted himself from the 1980s onwards to the reconstruction of historical cameras and photographic instruments. His meticulously crafted models were commissioned by leading museums in Berlin, Munich, Frankfurt/Main, Paris, London, and beyond. Among his most remarkable works from this period is the fully functional reproduction of Oskar Barnack's original Leica, a milestone in the history of photography.

Leica Ur-Leica Model 1:4 "Gerhard Lehner"

This is the smallest ever built replica of the Ur-Leica, the size is 30mm x 37mm x 20mm (1:4 to the original). It is gold and silver plated and is fully functional. A genius Austrian mechanic built this unique camera in the early 90s and even took self portraits through a mirror. It is mounted on a golden tripod and stored in a glass cloche. It comes with the letter of authenticity from its creator Mr. Lehner issued to Peter Coeln's Leica Shop in 1995 and 8 original self-portrait photographs taken on 8mm film with this camera.

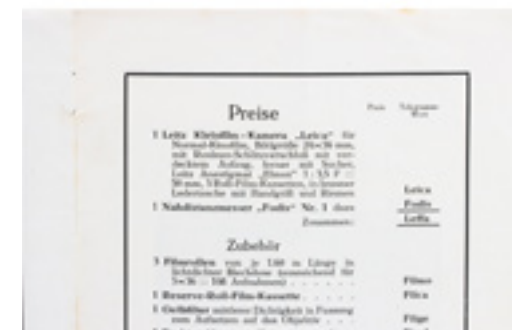

Leica I Mod.B dial-set Compur 'Close Focus'

When we first saw this camera, we thought it must be completely restored to the highest level. It turned out to be an fully, original, like new first version Compur Leica. Export camera in feet, base plate with "open-auf close-zu", finder engraved "Germany" on the side. It has all original features like finder, knobs have feathered arrows, early vulcanite etc., the distance scale is calibrated from infinity to 1.5 feet. This means that the focusing ring with the pointer needs to rotate from approximately 4:30 to 7:30 hours. For an ordinary 3-foot calibration, the length of the rotating barrel is shortened. The length of the rotating barrel on this camera is approximately 16.47 mm. Therefore you can focus at 1.5 feet (45.72 cm) instead of the typical 3 feet (91.44 cm). The camera was send to Australia in the 30th, never used and bought by the current owner 40 years ago.
